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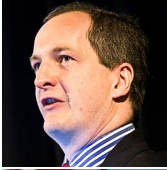

# Conference Speakers

**L**ORD JAMES BETHELL is the Director of Westbourne, the communications experts. He was previously communications director of Policy Exchange, the Westminster think tank described by the Daily Telegraph as “the largest, but also the most influential think tank on the right”. James was formerly managing partner of Portland, the communications agency with clients like Google, Apple, Porsche and Vodafone. He has five years’ journalistic experience as staff reporter at the Sunday Times and other national newspapers and political experience as a Conservative Parliamentary candidate, working for US Senator Robert Dole and EU Commissioner Lord Brittan. Lord Bethell is a keen mountaineer and backgammon player. He is a stalwart patron of the Association of Security Consultants.

**A**IR CHIEF MARSHAL SIR STUART PEACH, BA MPhil, is a graduate of RAF Staff College and Joint Services Command and Staff College, holding honorary Doctorates from Kingston University and University of Sheffield. Sir Stuart was commissioned into the Royal Air Force in 1977, flying Canberras and Tornado GR1. He commanded IX (Bomber) Squadron at RAF Bruggen 1994-1996. Tours include personal staff officer to the Deputy Commander and Commander-in-Chief in RAF Germany, Executive Officer to Commander Second Allied Tactical Air Force and Director Defence Studies Royal Air Force. Operational service includes Belize, Hong Kong and Germany, Deputy Commander British Forces in Turkey (Op Warden), UK Head Military Coordination Centre Zakho (Iraq), Detachment Commander in Saudi Arabia (Op Jural), Commander British Forces in Italy (Op Engadine), Air Commander (Forward) in HQ KFOR on Kosovo and Deputy Senior British Military Adviser in US HQ Central Command. He commanded the Air Warfare Centre at RAF Waddington, was Director General Intelligence Collection in the Ministry of Defence and Chief of Defence Intelligence and Deputy Chairman of the Joint Intelligence Committee, assuming his appointment as Chief of Joint Operations at PJHQ(UK) in March 2009. Air Chief Marshal Sir Stuart Peach is married with two children. He describes his interests as: poor skiing, worse golf, better cooking and passion for military history.

**R**OD LEEMING is Managing Director of Global Open. A former Special Branch officer, Rod has unrivalled experience of dealing with a diverse range of threats. Rod provides a unique service to clients facing threats from serious activism including those from animal rights, environmental issues, anti-corporatism and anti-globalisation. He is experienced in providing fast access to information in order to avoid the effects of economic sabotage and personal harassment.

She is a Freeman and Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Security Professionals. Sue was winner of the end-user category in the 2012 ‘Women in Security’ Awards, and is one of the most qualified and respected women in the global security industry.

**G**RAHAM SMAUL MSc is an experienced manager in the commercial security hostile environment sector. Following a 13 year career as a commissioned officer in the Irish Defence Forces, where his overseas duties included Chad and Kosovo, he entered the private security sector where he has worked in Libya, Somalia and Iraq. Graham recently completed an MSc in Security Risk Management from Leicester University and his dissertation ‘An Examination of the Risk Management and Business Continuity Management Policies and Procedures at Dublin Airport, Ireland’ won him the prestigious ASC Imbert Prize, awarded personally by Lord Imbert, in 2012.

He has been a senior advisor to British and Foreign Governments on matters of Protection and Security, and a regular member of COBR committees in his field of expertise. Bob was the National Olympic Protection Coordinator responsible for all personal protection duties associated with the successful London Olympic Games 2012.
